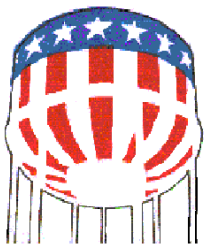

At 11 a.m. it's on to the Omni Theater for the presentation of **Arabia!** The brand new *Arabia* Omnitheater film is the first major film production to be granted access to more than 20 locations across Arabia, giving you an unprecedented look at a rich culture, history and religion that has long been hidden from the West. Then, lunch is on your own at the Elements Cafeteria. After lunch, we enter the traveling exhibition **The Dead Sea Scrolls**. These objects of great mystery, intrigue and cultural and spiritual significance are steeped in scientific, religious and cultural meaning. At the conclusion of *The Dead Sea Scrolls* exhibition, which showcases the oldest-known hand-scribed record of the Hebrew Bible, you'll see *The Saint John's Bible*, which represents history's *newest* hand-written illustrated Bible. A work of art that illuminates the world today, it's the first complete, handwritten and illuminated Bible to be commissioned in 500 years. It uses ancient techniques—it's written on calf-

skin vellum with quills, natural handmade inks, hand-ground pigments and gold leaf—to present themes, images and technology of the 21st century. The result is a project that has monumental artistic and spiritual significance for our time; originated right here in Minnesota. Register by 4/7/10.
