SOAR in Wabasha at the National Eagle Center **Wednesday, March 21, 2012**

On almost every day in March in Wabasha, MN you can look toward the sky and view our majestic national symbol: the **American Bald Eagle**. March is the peak month for watching eagles soaring, catching fish, nesting, screeching and chattering. Two separate observation decks at the **National Eagle Center** provide an incredible opportunity for you to view the many eagles that call the Mississippi River around Wabasha their home throughout the entire year. You will have time to explore the center before attending an **educational presentation** by a knowledgeable naturalist. You'll meet one of the resident eagles up close and personal and watch them feed on the delicacy du jour (usually a rodent).

Before going to the Eagle Center, we'll make a couple of stops along the way to observe the eagles in their natural habitat. Then it's off to lunch at the **Coffee Mill Golf Course** where you'll enjoy a hearty meal of **broasted chicken, salad, mashed potatoes, vegetable, beverage and dessert**.

After our Eagle Center adventure, we'll make a



brief stop at the **LARK Toy Factory**, one of the largest independent specialty toy stores in the country. With over 20,000 sq. ft. to explore, children of all ages find delights old and new. You might even want to take a ride on the amazing hand carved carousel!

For over a quarter of a century, LARK Toys has offered remarkable toys, most notably their own handmade heirloom wooden toys. They also offer wonderful handmade candies, unique children's books (perfect for that grandchild), lots of trinkets and gifts and more! 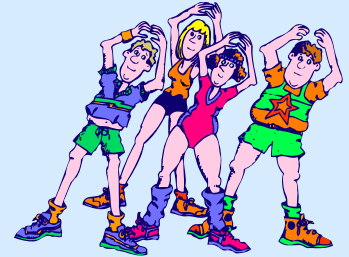

Spring Lake Park Recreation is proud to be offering Defensive Driving Classes through the **Minnesota Safety Council** and taught by the **retired Chief of the State Highway Patrol, Anne Beers**. Classes are held at SLP City Hall, 1301 81st Avenue NE, Spring Lake Park. **Please include your driver's license number when registering.**

This course is required for all adults 55 and over who wish to receive a minimum discount of 10 percent on their automobile insurance. Once you have completed the eight hour course, you must take a 4 hour refresher course every 3 years to maintain your discount.

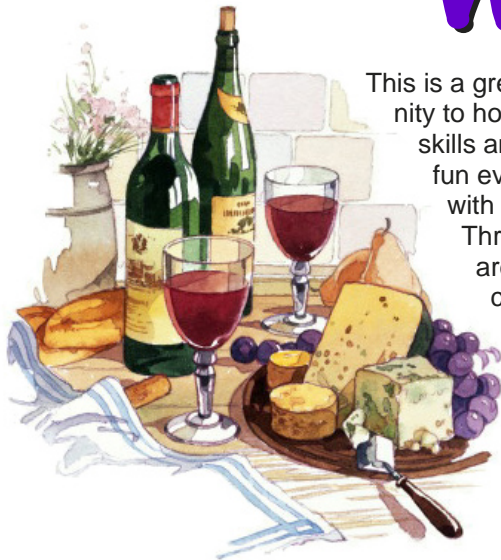

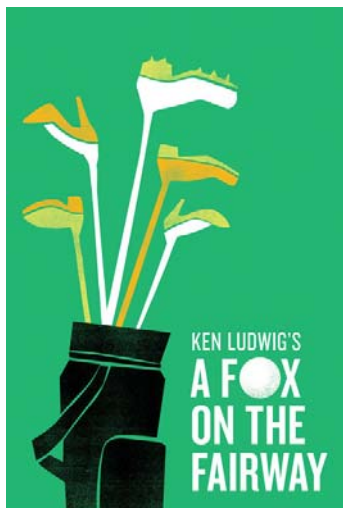

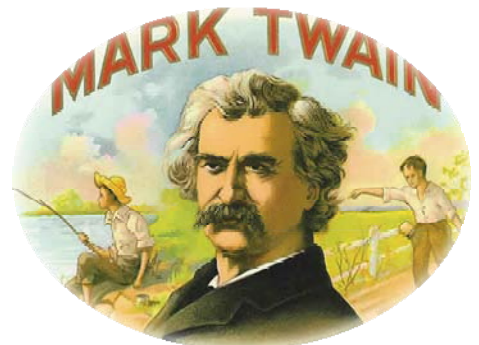
